







Roughan Interior Design

The interior designer worked with Roger Hirsch Architects Myriam Corti to repurpose and revitalize a three-bedroom Morton Square penthouse in the West Village of Manhattan. Entire apartment "was essentially torn down and recreated," said interior designer Christina Sullivan Roughan. Previous owners used this bedroom for their baby, while the new owners dedicated it to their 19-year-old son, a space he could use now and grow into later. The sidewall was removed to allow more open space, and the biggest challenge was creating a lounge area and a small office area, while simultaneously creating a "very masculine bedroom."



The carpet is Belgium wool and the curtains are Coraggio silk. Mink fur throws on the Roman Thomas chair and on the sofa contrast nicely with the room's overall lightness. So, too, do the leather pillows and the mahogany drawers from Madeline Stuart.
